Feedback and follow-up actions from the previous school year

- 1. Ten priority values and attitudes "Perseverance", "Respect for Others", "Responsibility", "National Identity", "Commitment", "Integrity", "Care for Others", "Law- abidingness" "Empathy" and "Diligence" were incorporated into the Catholic education core values and used to refine the Students Development Framework. Professional development programme will be arranged to deepen teachers' understanding of the core values.
- 2. Mental health programmes and workshops will be continuingly arranged by social workers and guidance team to reduce the negative emotion such as anxiety and depressive symptoms for students. More activities were organized to nurture students' resilience in adversities.
