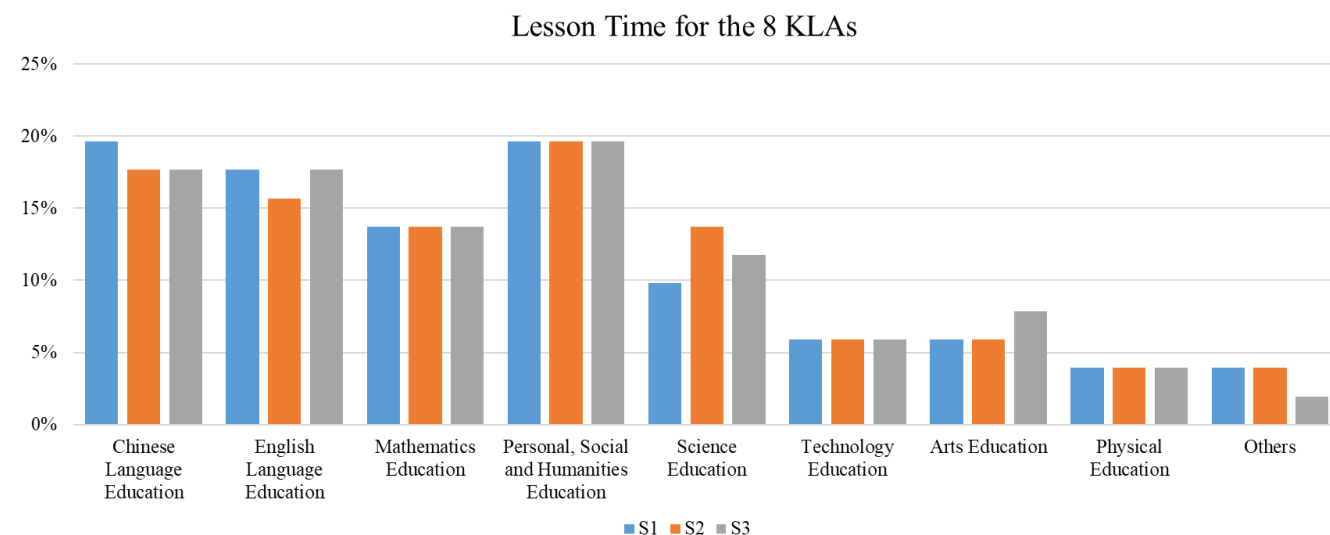

## 2. Achievements and Reflection on Major Concerns; Feedback and Follow-up

- Major Concern 1: Fostering self-regulated learning skills to enhance learning effectiveness

Achievements			
<p>The major concern emphasizes teachers' efforts in incorporating e-Learning strategies in 4Ps (i.e. preparation, participation, presentation and possession) to strengthen students' engagement in learning. It also stresses the importance of teachers' efforts on equipping students with subject-specific learning strategies, giving feedback and providing self-learning materials for students to foster their self-regulated learning skills.</p> <p><b>1. Strengthening students' engagement in learning</b></p> <p>Over the past academic year, teachers have practised e-Learning strategies in 4Ps (e.g. Kahoot!, Padlet and Jamboard) more regularly in the lessons to strengthen students' engagement in learning.</p> <p>The results of this year's school-based teaching and learning survey indicate that students have responded positively to their learning in 4Ps, the e-Learning strategies used by the teachers, and the overall learning effectiveness.</p>

Apart from the positive feedback from students about the e-Learning strategies in 4Ps in the school-based teaching and learning survey, students' perception of teaching in Stakeholders' Survey demonstrated that teachers were highly aware of the importance of providing learning strategies and feedback to help students improve their learning performance. High ratings have been observed in the survey items below:

## 2. Enhancing students self-regulated learning skills

Apart from providing more self-access learning materials on Google Classroom, teachers have designed mini research projects as learning tasks for the students to further enhance their research skills and self-learning capacity. Students have worked in groups, conducted online research on the assigned topics and given written and/or oral presentation as the learning outcomes.

### 3. Strengthening assessment literacy

To strengthen the assessment literacy of different subjects, assessment literacy reports have been collected from the DSE core and elective subjects as well as some selected junior secondary subjects (i.e. S1-2 Science and S1-3 Life and Society) in the first term.

Teachers have demonstrated heightened awareness of analyzing students' strengths and weaknesses in learning based on their assignment, test and exam performance. Curriculum design and teaching strategies have been adjusted to tackle the students' learning difficulties identified and improve their learning performance.

Sharing has been conducted in both the collaborative lesson preparation in the subject and the subject heads' meetings to promote the professional exchange among teachers on assessment literacy and curriculum implementation.



<b>Reflection</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>◆ Based on the evaluation findings, analyse the facilitating and hindering factors, and consolidate the experience and reflection derived from the process of planning, implementation and evaluation.</li> </ul> <p>Following the resumption of face-to-face classes in the post-pandemic era, more e-Learning strategies in 4Ps have been implemented by different subjects over the past academic year. The regular practice of 4Ps in classroom teaching and learning has effectively enhanced students' active participation in the lessons. Students' learning habits and performance have been improved.</p> <p>To develop students' self-learning capacity, about 5% of the curriculum content of different subjects have been provided as self-access learning materials on Google Classroom for the students. Mini projects have also been implemented in various subjects at different levels. The research works could effectively enhance students' collaboration with peers, self-confidence and self-regulated learning skills.</p> <p>The results of the school-based teaching and learning survey and the Stakeholders' Survey demonstrated that students have developed a good understanding of the learning strategies and they acknowledged teachers' efforts in providing them with learning strategies, feedback and learning opportunities inside and outside classroom to enhance their learning effectiveness.</p> <p>In the next academic year, the existing practice of implementing e-Learning strategies to strengthen students' engagement in learning as well as the practice of mini research projects to foster students' self-regulated learning skills will be maintained. Furthermore, the use of assessment data to identify students' learning difficulties and to inform curriculum planning and implementation will be strengthened further through the collection of assessment literacy reports from subjects and the sharing among teachers in collaborative lesson preparation and subject heads' meeting.</p>

The seven learning goals of primary education are national identity, positive values and attitudes, knowledge of key learning areas, language skills, generic skills, reading and information literacy, and healthy lifestyle. The seven learning goals of secondary education are national and global identity, breadth of knowledge, language proficiency, generic skills, information literacy, life planning, and healthy lifestyle.

## 2.2 Major Concern 2: Strengthening Catholic Education Core Values

### Achievements

#### **Teachers and Students share the values of Life, Family, Justice, Love and Truth**

- Using the whole school approach to promote the five core values of Catholic Education, programmes held this year successfully continued to raise students' awareness of the focus core value "Truth". Whole school mass programmes, such as School Commencement Mass, Christmas Prayer Services, Activity of Lent and Morning Prayer were held with the meaning of "Truth". According to the survey, students generally believed that they could reflect on issues related to "Truth" in these activities (Average 5.7 out of 7).
- Career Guidance Team invited a barrister to conduct a career talk for all S3 students. 79.6% of S3 students agreed and strongly agreed that the talk helped them understand how legal professions saw the value "Truth" in their career.
- A series of activities were organized to nurture students to become an informed and responsible citizen with a sense of national and global identity, appreciation of positive values and attitudes as well as Chinese culture, and respect for pluralism in society. And the P-value of National Identity aspects in APASO keep at highest 85.7.

#### **Foster students' positive attitude**

- Family Meeting "Be a better Shunleer" was conducted in January. 75% of students agreed that the Family meeting can build up "Supportive and Family-based school culture".
- Assembly talks related to mental health and stress management were conducted for different levels of students to develop students' positive thinking. 86% students showed their understanding of the importance of mental health and stress management based on statistical results.
- Some students show the ability to feel, express and manage a range of positive and negative emotions by attending the workshops and group activities organized by social workers, guidance team and student support team. The workshops and group activities heightened their awareness of mental health and students learned how to manage their emotions through different ways such as mindfulness and coped with stress when facing difficulties.
- "Core values" was one of the key components when teachers trained prefects. After the training camp the results of the survey of prefects agreed that it was beneficial. 86% agreed it improved teamwork, 82% agreed it enhanced problem-solving skills, and 77% agreed it boosted communication abilities. These training activities could help students improve their ability to cope with the difficulties and face adversity. Prefects performed in line with core values- "Responsibility, Perseverance and Commitment". They perform satisfactorily in handling daily works.
- With the collaboration of the Parent-Teacher Association, some workshops were held for parents. Most parents agreed that the workshop was useful and practical to release stress when dealing with the family affair or the communication problem with their children.

<b>Reflection</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ The school-based value education curriculum will be refined to better cater to the needs of students at different developmental stages.</li> <li>➤ School Commencement Mass and Christmas Prayer Services will be continued next year. Keep on using morning prayers as the medium to help students understand and reflect the core values of our school.</li> <li>➤ Students showed awareness of mental health by sharing their experience and difficulties with Social Workers, Class teachers and Guidance teachers. Some students displayed curiosity in symptoms of depression, Anxiety and early psychosis delivered by the Psychiatrist and Chinese Medicine Practitioner. Some students showed interest in knowing the ways to improve emotional, sleep problems and the ways to release the stress and anxiety when facing difficulties.</li> <li>➤ Some students were confident in applying positive thinking when facing difficulties. However, according to the statistical result from APASO, some students have negative emotions such as anxiety and depressive symptoms. The P-value of “Affect, Satisfaction in school” aspects in APASO were kept at lowest 15.9,</li> <li>➤ Statistics revealed that special attention should be given to students’ mental health and social health. Training on stress management should be arranged along with close observation.</li> <li>➤ Through participating in various CUHK-QSIP workshops and courses, our teachers have enhanced their knowledge of evaluation and understand the importance of data analysis.</li> </ul>
<b>Feedback and follow-up</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ For the upcoming year, the proposed theme is 'Thanksgiving'. The new theme will encourage students to express appreciation for those around them and also further develop a sense of empathy through interactions with others.</li> <li>➤ To echo with the implementation of positive values education, a “Thanksgiving” journal will be designed for students to write down daily life reflections.</li> <li>➤ We are aware of the importance of evaluating student performance in values and we have adopted the performance indicators established in Values Education Whole Curriculum Framework for Catholic Schools. We will continue to refine the measurement of students’ performance in values.</li> <li>➤ Mass activities related to mental health will be further modified to meet the needs of students in the next academic year. Mental health programmes, workshops and activities will be continually held by social workers, guidance team and student support team to reduce the negative emotion such as anxiety and depressive symptoms of some students.</li> <li>➤ In the coming year, the Prefect Team aims to build unity among the prefects, striving to foster a family-like culture that promotes positive peer relationships and a sense of belonging to the school.</li> <li>➤ Various activities promoting students' healthy lifestyles will be promoted in the upcoming year with the aim of fostering a holistic and positive outlook of life.</li> </ul>

## 2.3 Major Concern 3: Nurturing Students into Competent Shunleers

### 1. Enhancing the current ECA system

- Two new clubs 'Athletics Team' and 'Florist Club' have been established this academic year. The two new clubs are trendy among students, and they successfully raise students' awareness of one of the seven learning goals of secondary education – generic skills and a healthy lifestyle.
- Two existing teachers are reallocated to be the teacher advisors of the two new clubs while ten newly joined teachers are assigned to be the teacher advisors of ten other clubs.

### 2. Developing Students' Competence

- Four Activity Days were completed.
- Three leadership training classes were successfully held for the clubs' chairpersons and vice chairpersons. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Leadership Training Class (13 Apr) was arranged by Sheng Kung Hui St. Joseph's Church & Social Centre social workers. Before the training class, a workshop was held on 4 Mar to train the ECA Student Team to be facilitators. Throughout the training class, the chairpersons and ECA Student Team could enhance their interpersonal skills and leadership skills as well. The 3<sup>rd</sup> Leadership Training Class (10 May) was successfully held. Each club's present and coming chairpersons and vice-chairpersons are invited to share their vision and past experiences with other clubs through the designed games.
- ECA Shunleers' Day (5 Jul) was held during the post-exam period. Band, String, Drama and Dance Clubs are invited to perform.

Reflection

1. Enhancing the current ECA system

- Teachers may think that the school has provided more activities to the students (refer to Stakeholders' Survey – teacher). However, referring to the Stakeholders' Survey of students and parents and APASO III about physical training, the school may not provide sufficient opportunities, including activities outside of the classroom, to develop students' interests and life skills. Also, in the focus group interviews of S1 – S5, students reflect that the number of clubs and the number of activities they can join are limited.
- On the other hand, more than 10 teachers are freshly graduated or have less than 2 years of teaching experience. They may not have sufficient experience in organizing students' activities, especially those who have to take charge of the sports team.

2. Developing Students' Competence

- Besides club activities held on the Activity Days, more systematic leadership activities have been held by the Activities Team this year.

## **Feedback and Follow-up**

### **1. Enhancing the current ECA system**

- In order to suit students' interests, the number of clubs will be slightly increased upon teachers' duty arrangement. As more students are devoted to the clubs' activities, their collaboration skills will be increased. Also, the increase in the number of clubs will increase the breadth of knowledge of students.
- As many newly joined teachers in the coming year have to take charge of the sports team, more guidelines and briefings will be made by the PE teachers.

### **2. Developing Students' Competence**

- The number of activity days will be reduced to two. To fulfil the requirement of membership, students have to join the club's activities at least three times. Also, the committee members have to hold at least four activities. However, clubs are encouraged to hold more activities after school or during lunchtime. Besides, these activities may invite non-members to join.
- As the pandemic is gone, more resources from external organizations and external programmes and competitions will be explored. Through these activities, students' collaboration skills, communication skills and problem-solving skills will be enhanced.
- The clubs and students' organizations are encouraged to hold co-/cross-curricular activities. Through these activities, students' collaboration skills, communication skills and problem-solving skills will be enhanced.

### Summary of 2023-24:

The total expenses of DLG has been increased due to the resumption of several study tours. More S4 students participate in the Credit bearing courses of tertiary institutions in different areas.

### Suggestions for 2024-25:

Given that the gifted education programmes offered by tertiary institutions and professional bodies are costly (i.e. \$1000-\$5000) to most grassroot families in the school:

- For CSSA and Full-Granted students, about 50% of the programme fee could be subsidized by DLG while another 50% by School-based After-school Learning Support Grant (SALSG, recurrent) and/or Students Activities Support Grant (SASG, clawed back every year).
- For Half-Granted and other NON-CSSA/Full/Half-Granted students, about 50% of the programme fee could be subsidized by DLG while another 50% could be self-financed by themselves. In case the students express that their families cannot afford the programme fee, they could be given some subsidies through SALSG and/or SASG (i.e. by signing a circular to apply for “Special Half”).
- The DLG subsidy for each student in a year shall be capped at \$12000 and/or 3 programmes only.
