- ✧ Manage various facilities provided for student welfare, including those donated by PTA such as microwave ovens.

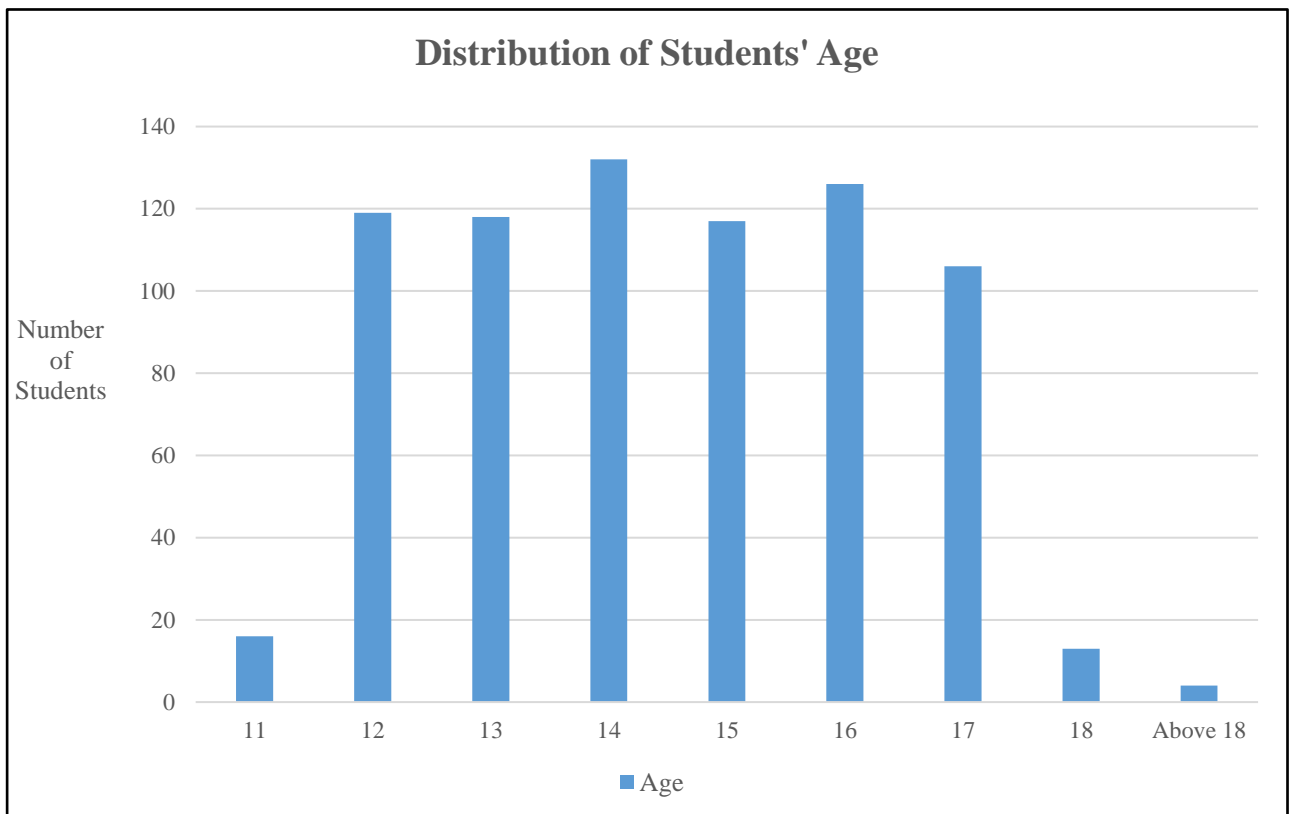
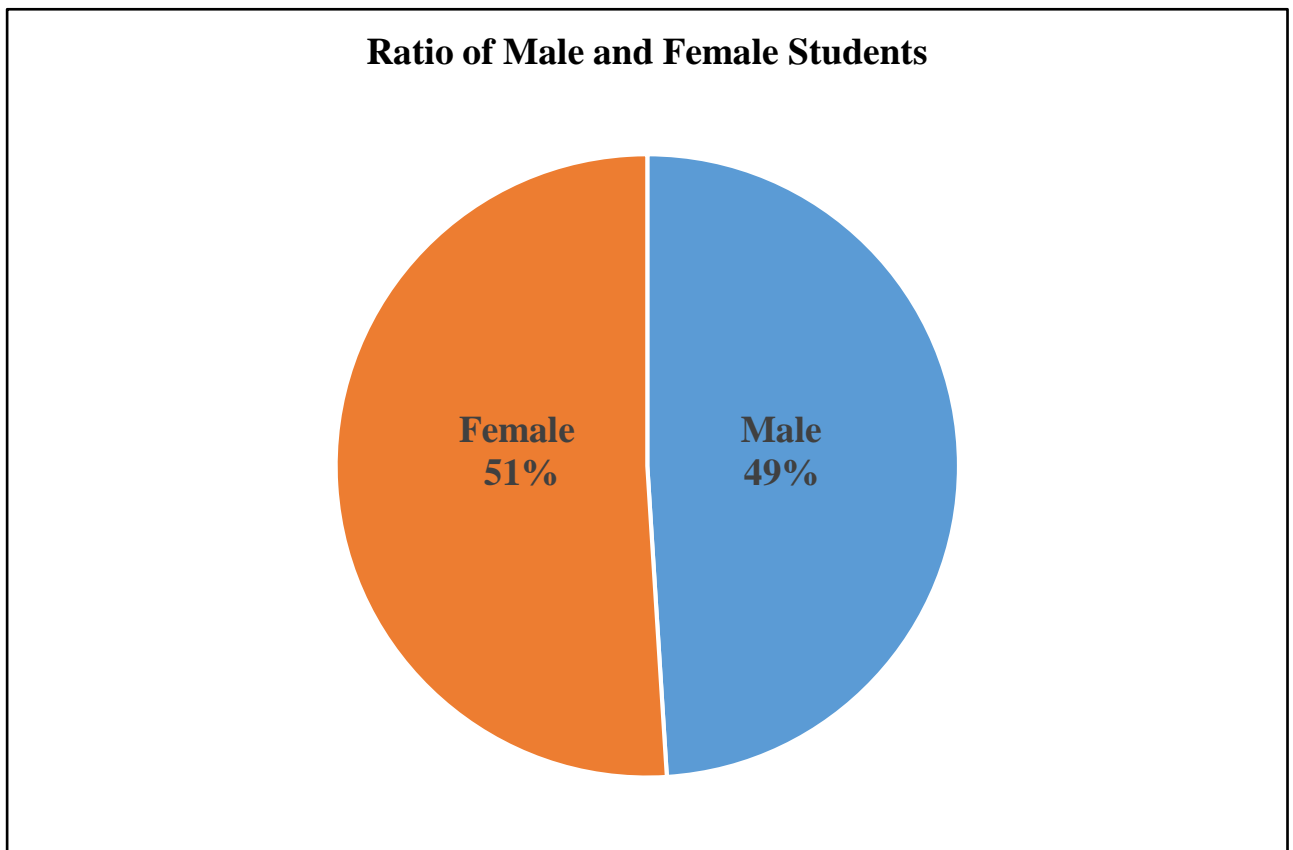
Focuses in the next 3 years:

- ✧ Upgrade and replace teaching/learning facilities, including that of classrooms and special rooms to meet the needs evolved due the implementation of 4Ps and/or Student-Centered Learning (SCL) pedagogy and other initiatives such as eLearning.
- ✧ Assist the General Office to manage the school facilities and play a more significant role in respective decision making by extending budget coverage to include the items previously managed by the General Office.
- ✧ Formulate procedure and work flow for routine tasks in the committee in the form of flowchart or word description whichever is more appropriate. Examples include S6 photo-taking, major-repair application preparation, movable-tower usage, handling student damage school property, etc.

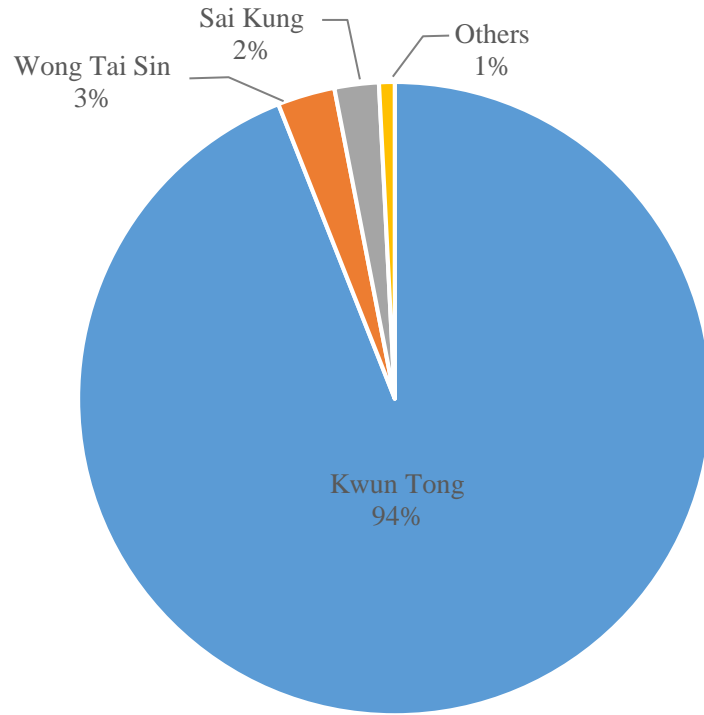
IT Committee

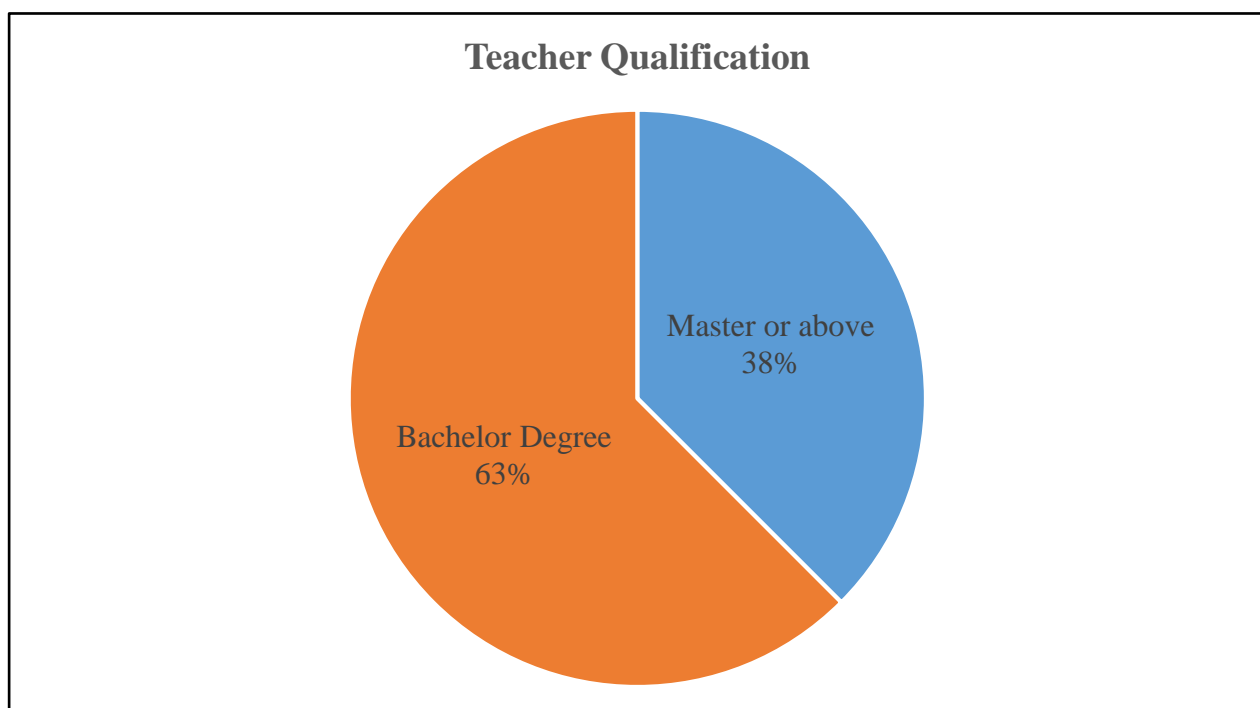
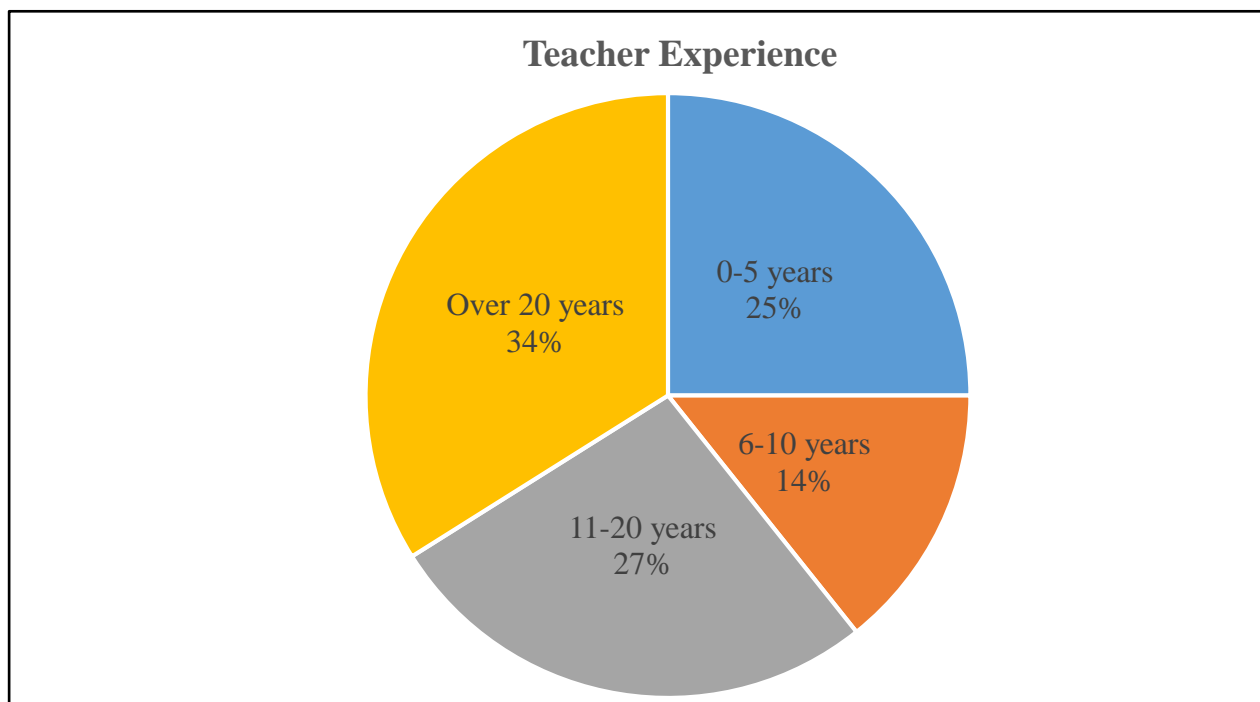
Distirbution of Students' Places of Residence

Special Features

- All classrooms are equipped with interactive multi-touch 85” monitor panel, projector and visualizer. Teachers employ 4Ps teaching strategy which stands for Preparation-Participation-Presentation and Possession.
- iSpace – IT-based classroom where student collaborative learning is conducted in class, and student self-learning is allowed after school
- Most venues with IT facilities remain open for students and staff after school
- The Religious Education (RE) Room and a backyard with a statue of the Holy Mother provide a place of tranquility and spirituality in which students and staff can take a rest or do their meditation.
