Interview with Lau Kwun Kin

S: Congratulations on getting the bronze medal in 100m race.

L: Thanks, I was really surprised to get such good result. You know, the boys from other schools are really fast.

I didn't qualify for the final 2 years ago. so I didn't expect to get any medals in the competition this time.

S: What are the key factors to your improvement in these 2 years?

L: Although I had no regular athletic training, the training with the football and handball team did help me a lot, so I have to express my thanks to Mr. Chan and Miss Chan.

S: What's your next target?

L: I want to push my 100m record to within 11.5 seconds.

Mr. Chan: Those who win are those who strive for excellence!

Do you want to know more about the CDSC Joint Athletic Meet? Mr. Chan is here going to tell you more.

S: What was the main purpose of joining the CDSC Joint Athletic Meet when we already had one of our own?

C: The Joint Athletic Meet is an important event for all diocesan schools. It is held every 2 years. It provides a good chance for us to communicate with other schools. And I always think sport is a good language through which we can exchange ideas.

S: What are your expectations of the athletes in the Joint Athletic Meet?

C: Comparatively speaking, fewer students from our school joined the Meet and our training is less intensive than that of other

schools, especially those single-sex schools. But this wouldn't put us at a disadvantage. Shun Lee also has some very good athletes who broke our school records not too long ago.

S: Then what about the cheering team?


C: The Students Union and the four Houses have trained them well. With experience gained from the last sports day, I believe, they can be impressive.

S: We have heard that other schools are very strong competitors and we still need to improve. How could our athletes improve themselves?

C: There is not enough time for training in our school. We are always in a rush which hinders the preparation. In contrast, our competitors are much keener to win and their coaches train them a lot. We are going to have some really tough competitions for sure.

S: What do you think about the students of Shun Lee?

C: Shun Lee is a good school. The students here are nice and polite. But the only fly in the ointment is that sometimes they only try to get their jobs done, without considering if there is any possibility for further improvement. They should learn that those who win are those who strive for excellence.

Ironically, the disabled have to 'walk' a lot more than the healthy ones in order to get themselves back to the mainstream of life. In the past what they gained was merely disdain and despair.

Back in 1944 when the British surgeon pioneer Dr. Ludwig Guttmann introduced sporting activities into treatment for the disabled, he successfully proved that sports can help those patients re-establish self-respect and self-discipline. Mind and body are made a unity once again.

This encouraging discovery lives today. In 1972, a group of warm-hearted people established the HKSAPD under the leadership of Prof. Harry Fang, G.B.M. and Mrs. Maureen Wagg, to plan and promote disabled sporting activities with the support from the government, private donations and corporate sponsors. It also takes talented disabled athletes to different local matches and the international stage.

Who would say that the disabled are not able to achieve more?

Honor on the Chair: Mrs. Wong Pui-yi, Agnes

'No sacrifice, no victory.' Many would find this line cool to say but few understand the real meaning of it. But Mrs. Wong Pui-yi, the famous local wheelchair athlete and the guest of honor of the CDSC Joint school Athletic Meet definitely delivers us a living example of the motto.

Despite the piercing wind, the ruthless rain, and the Cold Weather warnings, Mrs. Wong's speech heated Siu Sai Wan Sports Ground with the story about her rollercoaster-like career.

It was 1992 in the Barcelona's Paralympic Games she fetched her first gold ever. Her career rise continued in the following Atlanta's Paralympic Games in which she fetched a Silver and in 1998 she got another Gold in the World Championships hosted in Paris.

But good time never lasts. As the competitions got tougher over the years, her world's ranking started to slide. She even missed some big international matches. But she showed us that one couldn't win

without loss. She then met her new coach, changed her style of playing and started to win again.

She has been fighting to get into the Beijing Paralympic Games this year. Though in 2007 she received disappointing news from the HKSAPD that her chance was slim, she kept on joining overseas tournament even on self-financed basis and got 1 Gold, 2 Silvers and 1 Bronze in 2007.

This is what "NO SACRIFICE, NO VICTORY" really means.

The heats were held on Saturday and ended by lunch time, giving all the participants their much deserved rest after the gruelling heats, matched with the heat of the now not-so-friendly sun.

Wisdom House boys A-grade completed the race in 0'53.09min.

In addition, the inter-house relays run by the teachers were very impressive as they showed off hidden potential and strengths, with Miss Chow's team showing great wisdom as they set the pace for her to lead it to victory since Mr. Kwok, a rival, honestly made everyone else look as if they were walking!

Loyalty House, this year, showed great team spirit when they came second after Wisdom House. It seems Courage was rather laid back as they were last year's champion and was unable to defend its title while Honesty, which unfortunately in the real world does not do too well, pulled in the rear.

Putunghua or Not to...!

Should Putunghua (PTH) be used to teach Chinese in Hong Kong?

Hong Kong as an international city has a tremendous language demand on its citizens. The students in Hong Kong are expected to master 3 languages, Cantonese, English and Mandarin.

Cantonese is native to Hong Kong, so most of the students don't have problems with it. Nor do they find too much difficulty in English that they were introduced to in kindergarten with plenty of practice. Many students can speak fairly fluent English. But, when it comes to PTH, the story is completely different. Most schools and students just treat PTH as a minor subject. The students have only 1 to 2 lessons every week. Since the value of PTH is recognized among parents and employers, there is an urge for more exposure of students to PTH. Because of this, the Education Bureau is planning to spend HK\$200 million to help Hong Kong Schools use PTH as the medium of instruction for Chinese language schools.

But are students in Hong Kong able to learn Chinese through PTH? For the primary students who are only 6 to 12 years old, learning Chinese may already be a difficult task.

Using PTH as the medium of instruction may just be adding barriers for them. Imagine, the primary students who still do not have a solid foundation of Chinese language, and then they are required to learn Chinese language in a language that they seldom or never use, they would not be able to learn Chinese or PTH well.

Of course, to keep the competitive edge of Hong Kong, it is important to raise the citizens' language ability. But, in education the students' interest should be prioritized. So, the capability of students should also be considered.

Instead of using PTH as a medium of instruction, the Education Bureau should first encourage schools to create PTH atmosphere, let the students use and learn PTH naturally.



Debating Team


I have heard that debating is actually arguing. But for sure it's more than that. It's arguing with evidence and you will be more knowledgeable about things after each match.


